

Name of the monument: Memorial to the victims of World War I and Liberation Monument, also called Mohyla (*the Barrow*) or Hradisko after the name of the place where it stands.

Place: Velký Týnec (Olomouc District, the Czech Republic)

Construction year: 1921 (the ceremonial presentation to the public on 18 Sept. 1921 was attended by the President of the Czechoslovak Republic T. G. Masaryk)

Name of the architect: František Kolář (from Prague)

Architectural style – uncategorizable

Usage: The monument was used and still is as a memorial, where once a year the people of the village gather to pay tribute to the victims of both world wars. This event is part of the All Souls' Day celebration (on 2nd November) and a large part of the village participates in the latern parade here. It is also often visited by people who want to enjoy the beautiful view from the place and have a good rest close to the forest.
